### **Chapter I OPERATIONS**

### **Search and Rescue**

Kentucky Wing was tasked with two SAR Missions during CY 2021.

**Mission # 21M0157** on 17 April 2021 was tasked by AFRCC for an ELT at Muhamad Ali International Airport (SDF). Upon dispatching of UDF Team from Bowman Field (LOU) they conducted electronic search of Bowman Field and then proceeded to SDF. Upon arrival at SDF the team reported sudden silence of ELT Signal from the United Parcel Service (UPS) World Port facilities. They later discovered that UPS was conducting long term ELT test of their equipment. KYWG utilized 7 members, with 21 total man hours invested in the search.

**Mission # 21M0481** on 20 September 2021 was tasked by AFRCC for an ELT at Willow Island Airpark (58KY) southwest of Shelbyville, KY. An urban direction finding (UDF) team from Stuart Powell Cadet Squadron (KY122) was dispatched to respond. The UDF Team located an aircraft on the field that had not flown in some time. 5 personnel were signed into the mission. AFRCC credited KYWG with a Non-Distress Find.

### **Disaster Response**

Kentucky Wing was called upon for four disaster relief missions during CY2021.

**Mission # 22C3674** was opened by the CAP NOC in support of local COVID19 operations on 5 OCT 2021. The purpose was to provide Points of Distribution (POD) operations across Kentucky. Support centered around the community food banks, and POD sites in the unloading, organizing, and delivery of food items and supplies for the community. Auxiliary Airmen from KYWG HQ (KY001), Frankfort Composite Squadron (KY058) Bowman Field Senior Squadron (KY214), Stuart Powell Cadet Squadron (KY122), Southern Kentucky Cadet Squadron (KY300), Group II HQ (KY502), and Group V HQ (KY505). 33 members were signed into the mission. This mission was extended into CY22. This effort is included for Presidential Disaster Declaration.

**Mission # 22C4209** was opened by the CAP NOC on 11 December 2021 at the request of Kentucky Emergency Management (KYEM) in support of a severe tornado outbreak starting in Southwestern Kentucky extending through Central Kentucky. 40 Auxiliary Airmen signed into the mission from INWG, ILWG, OHWG, MIWG, KYWG, and GLR in support. A total of 26.3 hours were flown on 15 air sorties and 6 ground sorties in support gathering photo assessment of the tornado track with Maysville, KY being the hardest hit. This tragedy is included in a Presidentially declared Disaster.

**Mission # 21-1-4215** was opened by FEMA on 14 December 2021 at the request of the National Weather Service. Flight operations were conducted to retake photos of the tornado track. 23 Auxiliary Airmen were signed into the mission for a total of 3.1 hours of flight time. These operations are included in a Presidentially declared Disaster.

**Mission #22C4235** was opened by CAP NOC on 16 December 2021 at the request of Kentucky Emergency Management (KYEM) to support local communities that were suffering from the aftereffects of storm and tornado damage of 11 Dec 2022. The mission lasted 15 days with 62 Auxiliary Airmen supporting. A total of 26.5 tons of food and supplies were unloaded, organized, and prepared for distribution utilizing 70 ground sorties. <a href="These">These</a> operations are included in a Presidentially declared Disaster.

# **Homeland Security**

Kentucky Wing was not assigned any Homeland Security missions for CY2021.

# **Counterdrug Operations**

Kentucky Wing no longer participates in the Counterdrug mission set.

### **Chapter II AEROSPACE EDUCATION**

### **Internal Aerospace Education**

Kentucky Wing hosted its first STEM Academy and AEO Workshop December 3-5 2021 in Bowling Green, KY that hosted 33 cadets from 8 squadrons. Those cadets that graduated received their STEM badges. 11 senior members participated in the AEO Workshop.

### **External Aerospace Education**

A more focused effort was put forth as KYWG airmen worked to expand the external Aerospace Education mission. CMSgt Cory Felts and Ms. Lindsay Ames' 5th grade STEM class received the ACE Plus Adopt Spirit Award for their partnership at Tate's Creek Elementary School in Lexington, KY. Capt Janet Bryant was named ACE "Special" Science Teacher for her work at The Hive, a school where young adults with many types of disabilities work on social, daily living skills and educational activities. Kentucky Wing was able to conduct 63 sorties in support of AFJROTC Orientation Flights in support of AFJROTC units for Russell Springs, Casey County, South Laurel, and Bell County High schools. They were scheduled to support AFROTC Flights for the University of Kentucky, but were unable to due to cancelation.

Kentucky Wing was able to conduct 4 sorties for TOP flights which were for educators around the state that included TV media exposure in Lexington, KY.

### **Chapter III CADET PROGRAMS**

### Cadet Programs

The cadet program in the Kentucky Wing continued to suffer from the effects of COVID19, and the impact reduced participation at local unit meetings, and wing wide activities were forced to implement through COVID19 CAP and State protocols. Cadet membership suffered throughout 2021; however, it started to regain strength as the lifting of restrictions were released. During this period, cadet mission participation was strong, with cadets wanting to put their training and skills to use in their communities. Points of distribution were of the largest mission activity especially centered in Danville, and Bowling Green. Orientation Flights were absent throughout the wing. Many cadets took advantage of special allowances to continue their advancement while restrictions were in place. Cadet's and their families sought out as many opportunities they could in this less than ideal environment. A new cadet wing commander was appointed C/Capt Cole Blakeman from the Stuart Powell Cadet Squadron KY122 in Danville.

### **Cadet Activities**

NCSA Review Board. The wing commander held the annual National Cadet Special Activity (NCSA) Review Board for cadets and senior members who intend on attending one of the multiple activities held around the country. This board is held to determine those that are selected for Green Lights and advanced slotting by NHQ Cadet Programs. It is also an opportunity for the wing commander to learn more about the cadets in the wing and hear directly from the cadets what they want or need from the wing for their program. Along with briefing legislators and their staff, these auxiliary airmen had the honor of briefing Command Chief Master Sergeant of the Space Force, CMSSF Towberman on his first CAP briefing ever.

**Summer Encampment.** After a year absence, Kentucky Wing held it's summer encampment at the Wendell H. Ford Regional Training Center (WHFRTC) in Greenville, KY. Cadets and senior members were able to participate in a number of educational opportunities that followed the NHQ standard curriculum. A highlight for the students and staff were the Blackhawk helicopter orientation flights provided by the Kentucky National Guard as well as CAP Orientation Flights out of nearby Muhlenberg County Airport.

Great Lakes Region Cadet Leadership School (RCLS) Kentucky Wing again hosted the Great Lakes Region Leadership School under the direction of CMSgt Cory Felts from 27 DEC 2021- 2 JAN 2022 at Fort Knox, KY. The course is a highly academic rigorous environment for cadets in the grade of C/MSgt and above. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year KYWG has hosted this course that is a prerequisite for the Ira C. Eaker Award.

**Kentucky Wing Cadet NCO Academy.** This course was held from 27 DEC 2021-2 JAN 2022. at Fort Knox, KY. The goal of this course is to provide the cadet with a foundation for the intermediate phases of the cadet training in Civil Air Patrol. NCOLC stresses the fundamental aspects of instructional techniques, evaluation methods and intermediate leadership laboratory skills.

Wreath Laying at State Capitol Rotunda for Wreaths Across America. On 13 December cadets gathered for the annual laying of a wreath in the State Capitol Building in Frankfort by Civil Air Patrol in association with the Wreaths Across America program. This year C/Capt Matthew Barham was honored to assist Commonwealth of Kentucky Governor Andy Besher in laying the wreath at the ceremony. Governor Besher posed for photos with the cadets who attended.


